The Nebraska Supreme Court continues to carefully monitor the evolving circumstances presented by the spread of the COVID-19 disease. Pursuant to the authority vested in the Chief Justice of the Nebraska Supreme Court under Neb. Const. art. V, § 1, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 7-102, and Neb. Ct. R. § 3-100 et seq., the following administrative order is entered for the following reasons:

WHEREAS, conditions in the State of Nebraska have changed regarding COVID-19 positive case numbers, and with the future trajectory of COVID-19 positive cases unknown at this time, in-person education may be deemed unsafe or inadvisable for the near future; thus, changes to the approved methods of receiving Mandatory Continuing Legal Education are warranted;

WHEREAS, many educational programs have been made available to attorneys in a remote or live-streamed manner;

WHEREAS, under Neb. Ct. R. 3-401.8(A), only five (5) hours of computer-based legal education may be obtained in one year;

WHEREAS, the Nebraska Supreme Court has approved waiving the requirements for in-person continuing legal education for 2021 to allow attorneys to obtain all required education in a computer-based and remote fashion;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the requirements of Neb. Ct. R. § 3-401.8(A) limiting computer-based education to five (5) hours per year are waived for the 2021 calendar year.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:


1) The Attorney Services Division shall inform all Nebraska attorneys subject to Mandatory Continuing Legal Education of the change in requirements for legal education for the 2021 calendar year;

2) The Director of the Attorney Services Division shall approve all computer-based legal education that otherwise complies with Neb. Ct. R. § 3-401.1 et seq. for the full ten (10) hours for the 2021 calendar year;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the requests of the Nebraska State Bar Association and Omaha Bar Association to waive the provision of § 3-401.4(C) allowing only legal education hours obtained in a setting in which the presenter is present with the attendees to carry over to the next reporting period is hereby denied.
